Alligator Alcatraz - Framing

Alligator Alcatraz is detaining criminal illegal aliens in a secure, remote location, surrounded by miles of Everglades, making escape virtually impossible. It's helping keep our communities safe and enforcing our immigration laws.	41%
Adults and children with no criminal record are being held in harsh, inhumane conditions at Alligator Alcatraz. Florida taxpayers are footing a \$450 million annual bill that is enriching GOP-connected contractors, while families across the state face an affordability crisis with no meaningful relief.	43%

Methodology

Methodology

Polling data for this research includes 3,205 responses, collected via online web panels July 25-27. Results are modeled and scored on a representative sample of the Florida voter file, weighted to registered voters. The margin of error with 95% confidence is ±1.7pp for the full sample and larger within subgroups.
